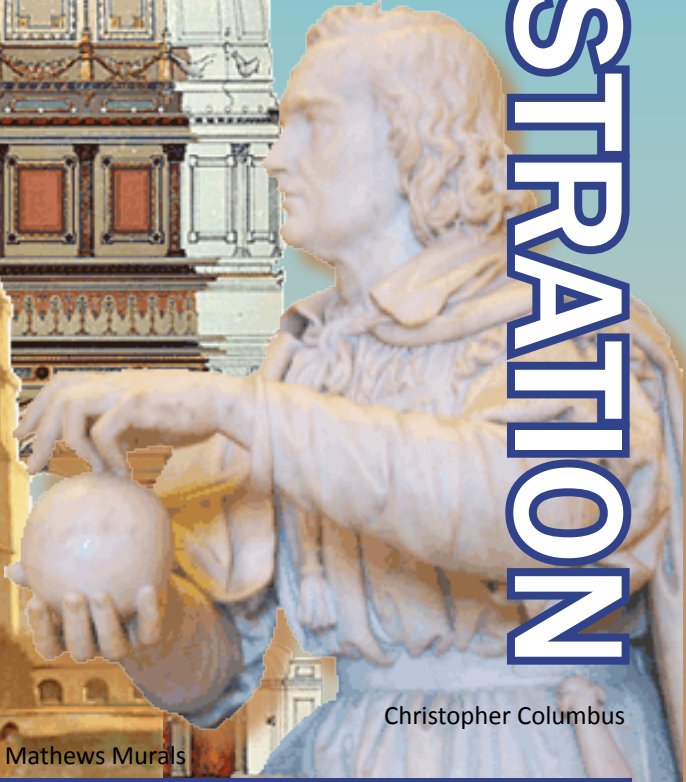

In 1856, Reuben Clark completed architectural plans for the Capitol. Ongoing controversy delayed its start and groundbreaking for California's Capitol occurred December 4, 1860. It took nearly 14 years and several administrations to complete the effort. Late in 1869 the Capitol was partially completed and able to accommodate the Legislature and several state officers including the governor. It took five more years to finish the building.

**CAPITOL FACTS**      **BALL ON THE CUPOLA**

On October 29, 1871, the crowning ornament, a gold-plated copper ball, was affixed to the cupola at the apex of the Capitol. This ball, nearly three feet in diameter, was part of Architect Rueben Clark's original plans. The California State Capitol was in part modeled after the United States Capitol, which features a bronze statue of "Freedom" as its crowning ornament. The presence of a gold ball, reminiscent of a gold nugget, is a reminder of California's Gold Rush heritage.

## HYATT RENOVATION

The Hyatt Regency Sacramento has just put the finishing touches on a \$4 million renovation to the lobby and hotel function space. This renovation complements the \$15 million guestroom renovation completed in 2009.

Stately elegance and modern sophistication are the design inspiration for the project. The new renovated space features a contemporary design and the addition of a Starbucks, located outside the hotel on the corner of 12th and K streets.



## CAPITOL FACTS

A large statuary group titled Columbus' Last Appeal to Queen Isabella, has occupied a prominent position at the center of the first floor Rotunda since 1883 when Darius Ogden Mills gifted it to the State of California.

In his studio near Florence, Italy, Larkin Goldsmith Meade, an American artist, carved the Carrara marble statue which was originally commissioned by Legrand Lockwood for his Norwalk, Connecticut mansion. After the death of her husband, Mrs. Lockwood sold the sculpture to Mills for \$30,000.

Not all of California's citizens agree with Mills that a statue of Columbus is appropriate for the Rotunda of California's Capitol. Before the restoration in the 1970s, many groups suggested that the Legislature relocate the statue and replace it with another statue of an important Californian. After all, Columbus himself never made it to within a couple of thousand miles of California. Despite such criticism, the statue remains in the Capitol Rotunda.

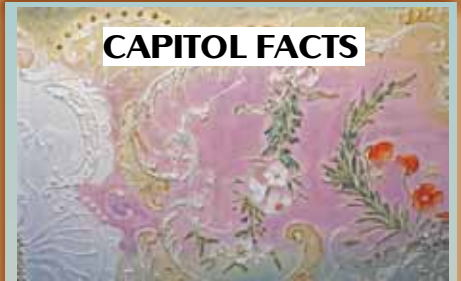
- Go to the contact link located under the Meetings tab at cahf.org. Use the predesigned form letter to request a visit with your legislator - just fill in the blanks.

## CAPITOL FACTS



**CAPITOL RESTORATION 1975-1981**  
The Capitol building had been used hard for its first 100 years, and by 1972 it was deteriorating and becoming unfit. Seismic studies revealed that the Capitol would be unsafe in an earthquake.

A restoration project was undertaken to make the building safe and solid and return it to its earlier grandeur.

Efforts were undertaken to recreate the original plasterwork. This was stified by the lack of any example since original photographs were black and white.

Miraculously, workers found an original full-color segment behind a heating duct that gave artisans a guide to re-create the decorations.

## CAPITOL FACTS

In 1913, the Legislature appropriated \$10,000 to decorate the Capitol rotunda. Arthur Matthews and his wife Lucia Kleinhans combined a romantic classicism and idealism with a Renaissance color palette and California imagery to create a series of murals that depict the historical periods of California. The artistic style became known as "California Decorative." These murals are now located in the Capitol's basement rotunda.
